License Home Childcare (LHCC) is an innovative model developed by PIRS that aims to enhance awareness, accessibility, and trust between PIRS (and BCCL) and the licensed home childcare sector. Over the past year, we have fostered strong, supportive relationships with Home Providers through regular visits by designated Resource Consultants and engaging workshops.

Resource Consultants and Home Visitors collaborate to build ongoing relationships and provide support to home care providers. We offer universal supports, professional development workshops for childcare providers, and regular capacity-building initiatives. Madiha, Nikita and Leila presented *Exploring the Mysteries of Children's Behaviour* workshop this past February with 51 providers in attendance.






TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE

This is included in their app, along with easy to use and customizable visual cue cards for communication that can be used for free on Android and Apple phones. Their newest addition is an AI based communication tool that can be used to generate communication trees with visual cues, as well as text to speech audio on the fly for those with difficulty communicating, or who don't use words to communicate.


